ATHENS DOWNTOWN DEVELOPMENT AUTHORITY COMMUNITY ENHANCEMENT PROGRAM

The Community Enhancement Program (CEP) is a partnership between the Athens-Clarke County Unified Government (ACC) and Athens Downtown Development Authority (ADDA) that allows the ADDA to host an annual calendar of quality events using downtown Athens as a community stage. CEP funds are made possible by the ADDA. These community events are intended to enhance the image of the community and provide benefits to the community at large, its visitors and citizens.

PROGRAM GUIDELINES

Eligibility Applicants must be a qualified non-profit organization or a qualified unit of the Athens-Clarke County Unified Government or the Athens Downtown Development Authority.

Event must be held in downtown Athens, Georgia.

Event must take place between July 1, 2019, and June 30, 2020.

Event must recognize the ADDA as an event partner in all advertising, marketing, and promotional materials.

Funding Request **Requests must be made by Wednesday, February 28, 2019, for the following fiscal year funding cycle.**

Requests must be made on the application form, available at www.downtownathensga.org. An itemized budget, number of event attendees, and positive impact to downtown Athens must be provided as part of the application. Application must be completed and all required information provided in order to be considered for funding.

Funds may be requested within 30 days of the event.

\$10,000 is the maximum amount for a funding request. Requested funds cannot be more than 50% of the event budget. Priority will be given to events that would not be possible without CEP funding.

After the event is held, a report must be submitted that documents how the CEP funds were used, and compliance with program guidelines. Failure to submit report may disqualify the event from future funding consideration.
